# Notes from the Chair

Welcome to the August edition of the Parish Council's newsletter.

So, this summer may not be going down in history as being one of the warmest ... or driest for that matter ... but, I hope you are all enjoying it nonetheless and have managed to get away if you wanted to or have enjoyed the village events such as the Regatta or the Hemingford Olympics (the rebranded Village Sports Day). Both events were well supported and the volunteers who organised them should be applauded.

With lots of organisations/groups not running over the summer months and many contributors out of the Parish, this is a slightly smaller edition than normal and will be published online only. We will return to printed copies for our October edition.

The Parish Council are delighted to be delivering a series of events for children and families over the summer, covering diverse interests such as sport, art, and the environment. We are acutely aware, that the village looks a little unkempt in places and can only apologise. The County Council's now rescinded decision not to use herbicides to control weeds on the County's roads and paths, and an unfortunately timed withdrawal of the PC's previous grass mowing contractor have not helped. That said, there have been upsides, notably the orchid pictured on the cover of the newsletter was discovered flowering at Vicarage Fields. Evidence of the positive benefits for those areas that have intentionally been left a little wilder as either part of the PC's Green Spaces initiative or Huntingdonshire District Council's Alternate Land Management scheme.

# Parish Council Updates

### Sometimes we can only apologise!

Unfortunately, due to personal circumstances, the Parish Council's (PC's) previous mowing contractor gave notice in early May and was unable to fulfil their obligations during their notice period. The responsibility for maintaining the grass verges and open spaces in the village is a mix of the PC, Huntingdonshire District Council and Cambridgeshire County Council.

The PC sought quotes for our areas and appointed Hemingford Horticulture as our new contractors in mid-June. Due to the length of the grass - May and June appear to have had the fastest grass growing conditions in decades - it's taking us some time to fully recover, and it's likely to take a few more cuts before it starts to look at its best again. We can only apologise.

### **Controlling weeds**

The Parish Council would like to thank all those residents who have been clearing the roads of weeds in front of their properties.

In our April newsletter we reported that Cambridgeshire County Council (CCC) had reversed its decision to stop using herbicides to control weeds on the County's roads and paths.

CCC's weed treatment programme re-started on

the 24th June and a chemical weed treatment was applied directly to weeds in the gullies of roads and on pavements throughout Hemingford Grey on the 12th July. A period of about five weeks is required for this weed treatment to take effect, after which CCC's road sweepers will be deployed to remove the dead weeds. A second programme of treatment will take place in October.

Please use CCC 's <u>reporting tool</u> if there any roads or paths you want to highlight to them. While the Parish Council report these things regularly, the sad fact is that the more people that report them the quicker they appear to get actioned. So, it's down to all of us to report them.



#### Kill your speed!

Residents remain rightly concerned about the speed that some cars drive through the village. While evidence obtained from Marsh Lane by our speed sign indicates that the speeds being driven along that stretch of road have reduced since the introduction of the 20mph limit, there are still many drivers who are driving well over it. In response to this and recent resident communications, the PC will be purchasing an additional speed sign – these signs will be regularly moved to different locations throughout the village. The Clerk has also asked the Police to undertake some targeted speed checks. Finally, a couple of residents have offered to undertake some community speed checks – an offer we have gladly accepted – if you'd like to get involved, please contact the Parish Clerk.

The Local Highways Initiative project that the Hemingford Grey and Fenstanton Parish Councils have been working on for some time on London Road/A1096 is now being implemented. The scheme includes a 50mph zone from the A1307 roundabout and an improved 40mph section starting prior to the houses and up to the Low Road/ Vindis roundabout. This will include new signage, road-markings, and a radar activated speed sign. Unfortunately, our proposal for this to be a 30mph limit was turned down by the County Council based on views provided by the County Highways Team and the Police.

## **Hemingford Grey Gardening Society (HGGS)**


