

Notes from the Chair

Welcome to the October edition of the Parish Council's newsletter.

And that was it! After of couple of brief weeks of warm weather at the end of August / beginning of September, Summer departed and Autumn arrived with a drop in the temperature, the evening's drawing in, misty and damp mornings, and in recent weeks a tremendous deluge of rain.

The unseasonal flooding and high river levels that we are currently experiencing, should reminds us all that while the river gives the village its charm and many opportunities for leisure, it also brings potential of negative impacts. While the Parish Council have adopted a draft emergency and resilience plan which could be enacted if the village was faced by an emergency situation, we are still keen to hear from anyone who would like to be involved with a community flood and resilience group, supported by the Parish Council, but delivered by committed volunteers as is best practice based on the experience of other local parish councils. If you would like to get involved or volunteer, then please let us know.

Huntingdonshire District Council's Local Plan update has reached a new phase. Having assessed all the sites that were identified / put forward, HDC have started the latest consultation phase which runs until the end of November. More details can be found within, but we would urge everyone to support or object to the HDC recommendations for the 13 sites identified within the Parish. We would be particularly keen for you to support the two submissions for 'open spaces and biodiversity' made by the Parish Council.

Finally, the Parish Council offers a warm welcome to the Parish to Reverend Timothy May, the new vicar of St. James', and his wife Beth. Many of you may well have already seen him out and about in the village with his dogs or on his bike.

Parish Council Updates

HDC Local Plan and call for sites

In January 2023, Huntingdonshire District Council (HDC) agreed to update its Local Plan. The Local Plan sets out a plan for future sustainable development in the district, by identifying key areas of land for development to deliver the homes, jobs and services needed in the district. It also includes policies against which all planning applications are considered.

As part of this process, HDC ran a Call for Sites last year between 29 March to 7 June 2023. This was an opportunity for people to send the council details of sites that might be suitable for allocation in the next Local Plan. Under four broad categories: residential use; commercial use; infrastructure; and open space use.

A total of 13 sites were identified / put forward in Hemingford Grey. HDC consider all those sites identified for residential development within the Parish 'unsuitable for development' with the exception of the Marsh Lane Lake site, which was put forward by Tarmac with a proposal to put 68 houseboats on the lake. The good news is that both HGPC submissions for 'open spaces and biodiversity' next to and opposite the school have been passed for further consideration.

Huntingdonshire District Council (HDC) is now consulting on the latest stage of the Local Plan revision. Details and instructions on how to respond are at <u>https://consult.huntingdonshire.gov.uk/</u>. The consultation closes on 27 November 2024.

HGPC will be considering its response to those sites within the village at its October meeting and relevant sites within Hemingford Abbots and Fenstanton at its November meeting.

The Council advises that residents should make their own comments supporting or objecting to the HDC recommendations. It is important that residents are seen to be expressing their opinions direct to HDC as well as at the relevant HGPC meetings.

For those who are interested or want to express their views, HDC will be running events throughout October.

A summer full of activities!

The Parish Council were delighted to be able to deliver a series of events for children and families over the summer, covering diverse interests such as sport, art, and the environment.

Wild Play and Discovery

Our summer events ended with the Scouts making bat boxes and then going out to listen for bats with Groundwork East. Other events included family wild play sessions at Daintree Green and at the Yes Estate, and an early morning moth event held at Vicarage Fields.

Creative Workshop



This summer, Cllr Maria Di Gaetano ran two days of creative workshops with children from across the village. As an artist and educator, as well as a Parish Councillor, Maria wanted to create a safe, respectful, and happy environment, where those attending could spend time exploring their artistic creativity while enjoying the day and each other's company.

The sessions received fantastic feedback from all those who attended, and it was noted that many particularly enjoyed as it was a non-sporting event. We hope to offer more sessions in the future.

Summer Sports Programme

As in previous years, we were also thrilled that we were able to offer so many children between the ages of 5-11 years old the opportunity to take part in this year's Summer Sports Programme run in conjunction with HDC. The programme ran on Monday afternoons for five weeks and the feedback we've received is that all those who attended had an enjoyable time.

Hemlocs by Simon Clemmow, Chair


