

Notes from the Chair

Welcome to the February edition of the Parish Council newsletter. As this is our first newsletter of the year, I'd like to wish you all a belated Happy New Year.

Weather events resulting in flooding, a cold snap, and storms can lead to impassable roads, potholes or fallen trees. While inconvenient, annoying, and sometimes dangerous, they can easily be reported to the County Council via their website and the more people that do, the quicker they generally are resolved. The recent weather also clearly shows us that winter isn't over yet. At the same time, the flowering Witch Hazel and Aconites, and lighter evenings are pointing the way to the coming Spring.

The beginning of the year, always provides us with an opportunity to consider new resolutions or identify things we'd like to get involved in. We currently have three vacancies on the Parish Council and would be delighted to hear from anyone who would like to join us. If being a Councillor isn't your thing, you can still all do your bit to maintain the parish – why not become a Tree Warden or join in at our upcoming litter pick.

We are keen to measure local need for and potential usage of a Hoppa bus service running between the Hemingfords and St Ives (including the Guided Bus stop and supermarkets). On pages 7 and 8 you will find a survey, we would really appreciate it if you could complete and return it.

Finally, while the Council continues to seek ways to improve the parish and our village environment, we know we don't have all the answers or even all the questions. Parish Council Updates

Grants available for local organisations - apply now!

The Parish Council has a limited amount of money remaining in this year's budget to award grants to local groups, charities, or organisations for "purposes, which may bring a direct benefit to the area or any part of it for some or all the inhabitants". An application form is available from the Parish Clerk and any received will be considered at our March meeting.

Recent high water

In early January the Great Ouse reached its highest levels at Hemingford and St Ives gauges since December 2020. However, this time the



Environment Agency (EA) only declared a Flood <u>Alert</u> for our area unlike during the previous event when it caused a certain amount of panic with a Flood <u>Warning!</u> At its highest the river was still about half a metre from the top of our flood bank but because the river stayed high for several days, there was a fair amount of seepage

under the bank. This meant that both the main and standby EA pumps at Filberts Walk were in full use and that Manor Road was flooded around the pavilion bends. We have not heard of any houses being affected but the Apple Orchard sewer did overflow for a couple of days with the effluent finding its way to the surface water drain and thence onward to the Marsh Lane lake.

The Council are still keen to hear from anyone who would be interested in volunteering for the Parish's flood and resilience group, be that as a coordinator, member or someone who could quickly offer skills and knowledge to the community during any large-scale emergency.

Tree Wardens will, where necessary, carry out a site visits to view the proposals to assist with preparing a response. Tree Wardens also provide advice on trees and hedges to the Environment Working Group to assist it in preparing recommendations for formsal approval by Council.

Reporting potholes and other highways faults



Potholes continue to be an ongoing issue for all motorists and the recent flooding and cold snap have further damaged our local roads. Please report highways faults (even if it's been previously reported) using the County Council's Highways Reporting Tool (highwaysreporting.cambridgeshire.gov.uk).

Faults reported in this way will be assessed by a Local Highways Officer within 10 working days.

To report a highways emergency that poses an **immediate danger to the public**, please call Cambridgeshire Highways on 0345 045 5212.

Planning committee matters

The Parish Council has no direct planning powers but is consulted by, and can make representations to, Huntingdonshire District Council (HDC). It is HDC's responsibility to inform neighbours of planning applications. Residents are urged to make their own comments on the HDC website. Councillors will usually call on the applicant and relevant neighbours to explain how the council considers applications and how residents can make their views known to the parish council and to HDC. The next Planning Committee meeting will be at 7pm on Monday February 12th in the Reading Room, High Street.
